

Welcome to Camp White!

Please read this brochure for general use information; don't forget to take the Nature Trail (the guide is the booklet with the green cover) if you get the chance.

In order to ensure that Camp White is used properly, we ask that the following policies are observed.

Camp White Use: Use is limited to Millwood church-sponsored programs, Millwood church members and their guests, and other Presbyterian (U.S.A.) groups and organizations. Non-church-related groups may use Camp White only with a Millwood church member present and serving as host.

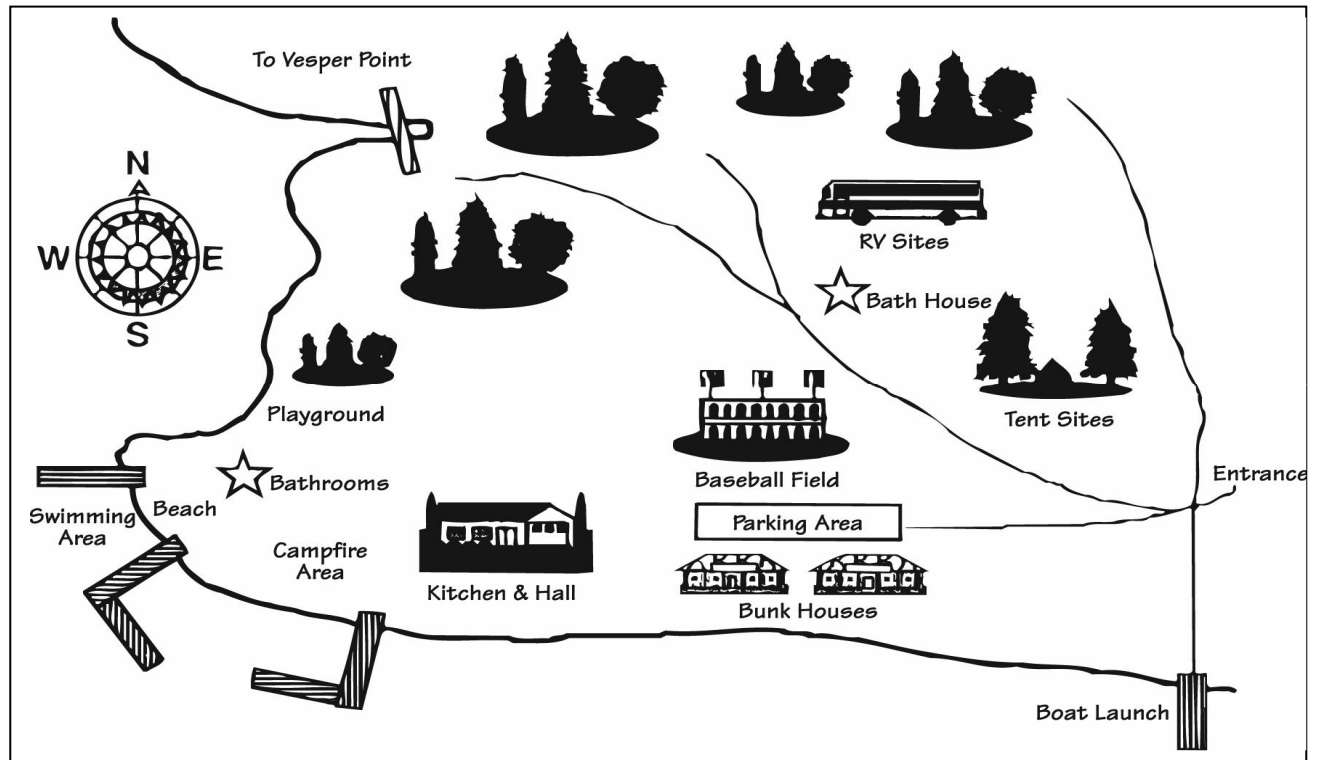
Community: Each person or group using Camp White does so with the understanding that other people may also use the facilities. No person or group has exclusive use of any portion of the Camp facilities at any time. Be courteous at all times and observe quiet time beginning at 10:00pm.

General Safety: Don't do things that might endanger people's safety or damage facilities. This includes: no alcohol, controlled substances, firearms, snowmobiles, off-road vehicles, or horses. Build fires only in fireplaces or RV fire-boxes. Fireworks are only permitted on the docks on the 4th of July.

Waterfront Safety: There is no lifeguard on duty. Swimmers swim at their own risk. Parents must be responsible for their children. Only swim in the designated area, with inexperienced swimmers staying inside of the first rope. Never swim alone, and do not attempt to swim across the river! No running or rough play on the docks or in the swim area. No throwing rocks, sand, or mud. Only one person may be on the diving board or slide at a time. Jump straight out from the diving board—not to the side. Bicycles are not permitted on the docks. Leave the life-ring hanging on the tree; it is not a toy and someone's life may depend on it.

Pets: All pets must be under the control of their owners at all time and on a leash in lawn area, with waste being promptly cleaned up. Pets are not allowed in the Swimming Area.

Sewage: Don't flush excess paper or other inappropriate items such as paper towels, sanitary napkins, etc.



Equipment: Return all equipment to its original location. Do not take the mattresses outside from the bunkhouses.

Garbage: Use the garbage cans, then empty contents into the large dumpster. Do not burn garbage. Ensure that the camp is clean when you leave.

Maintenance: Report any maintenance needs to the Camp Host, Caretaker, or Church Office.

Damage: Persons and groups using the facilities agree to pay for any property damage caused by their usage.

Security: Group leaders are responsible to ensure that all doors and gates are locked at departure.

Keys: Camp White keys may be obtained from the Church office between 9:00am and 4:00pm, Tuesday through Friday. A \$25.00 deposit is required for each key issued. Persons failing to return keys will forfeit the deposit. Camp White keys may not be duplicated or loaned.

Supervision: Each group agrees to provide its own counselors or supervisors to monitor personal and property safety, and to ensure that the Camp White rules are followed. The Camp White Host or caretaker provides general maintenance and is not there to supervise individuals or activities.

Failure to Comply: Persons or groups who fail to comply with these rules will be asked to leave.

Camp White exists largely through donations and volunteer help. To maintain and improve the Camp, we rely on your generous gifts. (We are open approximately four months each year with the average cost of operation being about \$500/week; with the majority of expense being from weekend activities.) **If you enjoy your time here, please show your appreciation with a donation.**
